Currently, the IRENE partners are in the process of finalising the Family Learning Toolkit -Comic Strips, Interactive Digital Magazines, and Audio Books. The toolkit will be presented to 10 families in each partner country. We are in the final stages of preparing for the translation of the In-Service Training Program, and we plan to conduct a final piloting to test the project results locally in each organisation's country. Despite this ongoing work, we have some exciting news to share.

IRENE LTTA - IN-SERVICE TRAINING PROGRAM FOR ADULT EDUCATORS

In March 2023, the IRENE project partners conducted an LTTA, which comprised a total of 50 hours within three days of activities. This was hosted in Poland, by VIVA FEMININA. On the first day, participants took part in a 7-hour workshop to introduce the topics of domestic violence in Europe, services working in this field, helpful advice, and roleplay activities for making effective referrals. The second day comprised a 7-hour workshop that demonstrated the best practices in supporting the family learning model; and on the third day, the final 7 hours of training aimed to highlight best practices in developing and producing comic strips and audiobooks using free software.



You can now see some of the comics that were produced during the workshops! These comics aim to support children and teenagers with strategies on how to deal with domestic violence in the safest manner and recognise instances of violence.





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
